If someone came to our country and wasn't familiar with Christmas, just listening to the music, they probably wouldn't get the idea that this holiday had anything to do with a little baby boy named Jesus, born 2000 years ago. Go to any neighborhood, and you'll see more Santas, reindeer, snowmen, and sleighs than you will see anything about Jesus. In fact, a survey shows that one-half of all Americans celebrate Christmas not as a religious holiday but more as a secular holiday.

When children across America go to bed on Christmas Eve night, most of them think a lot more about Santa and the North Pole than they are about Jesus and Bethlehem. But know this: if you take Jesus and Bethlehem out of the picture, there is no Christmas, nor is there really a need for Christmas. I want you to know some things about Christmas. It's not the Christmas of Santa Claus but the Christmas of a Savior. It's not the Christmas of a reindeer, but the Christmas of a Redeemer. It's not the Christmas of the North Pole, but the Christmas of Bethlehem.

The amazing thing is that we're not really sure in what year Jesus was born. We're not exactly sure what day is actually His birthday. Yet even though we don't know the exact date of that day, we do know it was the perfect day. We know that He wasn't born too early, and He wasn't born too late. He was born right on time.

Timing is everything. Have you ever thought about when He was born and how special that day was? Why was Jesus born when He was? Why didn't He come much earlier? Why did God wait around for thousands and thousands of years before Jesus came on the scene? Paul answers that question with a little statement we might miss or gloss over. Paul doesn't talk much about the birth of Jesus, but when he does, he tells us something that's just incredible. In Galatians 4:4, he says, "4 But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son..." Galatians 4:4 That phrase "fullness of time" is a very loaded Greek expression. It means something complete and fully developed, like a ripe apple ready to be picked or a pregnant woman ready to deliver her baby. It refers to an appointed time. Why wasn't Jesus born during the days of Isaiah? Or David? Or Ezekiel? Or Moses? Why was He born on the day He was born?

Here's the incredible truth we need to hear. This statement describes the exact moment in history when everything was in place, all the pieces were on the board, everything was perfectly lined up, and the stage was perfectly set for God to send His son. Jesus wasn't born one hour too early, one hour too late, or even a minute too early or too late. Paul is telling us that God had the birth of Jesus planned down to the exact second on His clock and down to the exact day on His calendar. God made a divine appointment, and God is never late for His appointments.

The only way for us to be made right with God is through Jesus Christ. For thousands of years, the Jews had waited for a Messiah. The Gentiles had waited on a Savior, but a little over 2000 years ago, on an exact date, in an exact place, God said, "The time is now and the wait is over." The timing was perfect. In the fullness of time, God sent His son. There was an exact time that Jesus should be born. There was an exact time that Jesus should die. There was an exact time when He should be raised from the dead. There was an exact time when He should ascend into heaven. There is an exact time when He is coming again. There is an exact time for you, your family, and your friends to put their faith in Jesus, and that time is now because timing is everything!

There's a song our HBC children have learned that has a great phrase..."we have so much, so much, so much to be thankful for". Isn't this SO true?


I am thankful for the Highlanders who took backpacks and filled them with supplies for children in East Tennessee who have experienced such devastation with recent hurricanes.
