# This year, we are celebrating our church's 75th Anniversary. Our church council, as well as some others, will be putting together some things to help us celebrate this milestone in the history of our church. Over the next several months, I want to share with you what has been and will continue to be the foundational building blocks that our church needs to continue building on as we enter the amazing future that God has planned for us. Those building blocks can be seen in Acts 2:41-47, right after the early church in Jerusalem saw 3,000 people baptized as followers of Christ. This passage offers a model for what the church should look like and highlights four key "building blocks" that should form the foundation of any church.

The first building block is Proclaiming the Word of God, whether that's from the pulpit or the Sunday School classroom. The early church prioritized preaching and proclaiming God's Word, which ought to be central in any church today. The Word of God is the core of spiritual nourishment; when you're Bible-based, you'll be Bible-blessed. When you come to church, you should hear what God has to say, and when we proclaim God's Word, it shouldn't be shallow or absent of biblical truth. As Paul told Timothy, churches must "preach the word." In many places today, there's a "famine" of biblical teaching, even in places like the Bible Belt, where churches may neglect to deliver the truth of God's Word.

The second foundational building block is Promoting fellowship. The Greek word for fellowship, "koinonia," means to "have in common," and it emphasizes a deep, relational connection rather than just superficial gatherings. The early church's fellowship involved sharing lives, caring for each other, and providing for one another's needs. Fellowship isn't just about socializing; it's a bond that mirrors the relationship with God. The more we fellowship with God, the more we'll naturally desire to fellowship with one another. The church was never meant to be a building where you sit, sing, listen, learn, and leave. A church should be a place where love and care are seen, people feel welcomed, and the hurting find comfort. The key to fellowship with others is fellowship with God. The closer we are to God, the closer we'll be to each other. Did you know that the more you fellowship with God, the more you'll want to fellowship with God's people, and the more you fellowship with God's people, the more you'll want to fellowship with God? The world needs to see that we love each other so much that they'll think to themselves, "If they love each other like that, maybe they will love me like that."

The third building block is Praising the Lord. Praise and worship were integral to the life of the early church, and that ought to also characterize the modern church. Churches should be filled with enthusiasm and joy as they celebrate God's goodness. The early church was alive with excitement, and that spirit ought to continue today. A church that praises God is a church where God's presence is felt.



The fourth building block is Proclaiming the Gospel. The early believers were committed to sharing the message of salvation through Jesus Christ, both inside the church and outside of it. This wasn't just the responsibility of the pastor but of every member of the church. When people come to this church, they should not be able to leave without knowing how to become a Christian, a follower of Jesus Christ. But this shouldn't be the only place, and the pastor shouldn't be the only person proclaiming the gospel. As the church grew, people took their faith and witness into the world, resulting in people being saved daily. We need to be a people who leave on Sunday and begin on Monday to take God-given opportunities to point people to the cross of Jesus Christ through our worship and witness. Proclaiming the gospel is central to the church's mission, and it's essential for us as believers today to not only hear the gospel but also share it with others.

These four building blocks—preaching the Word, promoting fellowship, praising the Lord, and proclaiming the gospel—serve as a timeless guide for what a healthy church should prioritize. The early church's focus on relationships with God and each other provides a model for how churches today should operate, emphasizing a commitment to faith, community, worship, and outreach. The foundation of the church begins with Jesus Christ, and every aspect of church life should reflect this central truth. So, let's begin the celebration as we continue laying the foundation.
